<p>Safe Communities Opportunity Centre (SORCe) 403-428-3300</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Location where people can access programs and services that address their current situation • Offers information, provides initial assessment to determine need, will offer counselling if needed, facilitate referrals for a variety of programs for each person's unique circumstance • Provides transportation to agencies when approved • Made up of multiple agencies coming together to provide resources including Alberta Health Services, The City of Calgary, Alpha House, United Way, and more 	<p>The Drop-In Centre: Affordable Housing Program 403-266-3600</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Three apartment buildings all with rent capped at 30% of residents net income • Residents are required to take part in weekly check-ins with a housing support worker • Full-time staff member works on-site with clients to facilitate group community-building activities, help travel to appointments, and to find work in their neighbourhood • Clients must not have any active addictions, mental health must be effectively managed, and must agree to maintain a clean apartment
<p>Salvation Army: Women's Integrated Supportive Housing 403-930-2711</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transitional (long-term) and emergency housing available for displaced and homeless women • Communal living environment, work with staff on a daily basis to prepare women to be able to live on their own • Women must be able to physically and mentally take care of themselves 	<p>Métis Capital Housing Corporation 403-569-9030</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides appropriate rental housing for low and moderate income Métis and Aboriginal families, seniors, and those living with a disability • Offers both Urban Aboriginal Housing, and Affordable Market Housing programs
